

The Maltese Islands








Agriculture in Malta

- Smallest holdings in the EU
- 1.3% of Gross Value Added
- 14,870 registered farmers
- Multifunctional role
- Limited water resources
- Whole territory considered as an LFA in the EU






Agriculture in Malta

Overview | Young Farmers in Malta

- 1,239 registered farmers < 40 years (NSO, 2020)
- Less YF in Malta compared to EU average (3.8% vs 6%)
- Full-time, part-time and subsistence farmers
- Access to land and capital are major challenges
- Entrepreneurial, collaborative and willing to invest

Local Agriculture - Current Situation

- Maltese agriculture getting smaller because of land development
- We do not produce much grains, corn, wheat and not enough fodder for ruminants
- Dependent on imports
- Warm climate is quite good for cash crops all year round compared to other European countries

- Water scarcity
- Small Fields
- Land transfer issues and land fragmentation
- Lack of diversification of agricultural products
- Lack of young farmers
- Introduction of new pests





"Family farms"

- No legislation in place
- Needs more awareness & discussion





Strategic Plan for CAP 23+



- No direct support specific to "family farms"
- Efforts more focused on young farmers
- Besides CAP support, the state supports local farming through subsidies
 - COVID-19 Pandemic
 - Fuel and grains





Our future plans

- Continue building bridges between local policy makers and young farmers
- Invest more resources to engage with more young farmers within the Maltese Islands
- Increase further our outreach towards the general public
